My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

On this Second Sunday of Advent, the Church invites us deeper into the spirit of preparation—not just for Christmas as a date on the calendar, but

for Christ who comes to meet us: in history at Bethlehem, in mystery in the sacraments, and in glory at the end of time. Today's Gospel introduces us to John the Baptist, the voice crying in the wilderness: "Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths!" His words are not gentle suggestions; they are a call to conversion, an invitation to examine our hearts and make room for Christ. Advent is not only about waiting; it is about active waiting, a waiting that transforms. The first reading from Isaiah gives us a beautiful vision of hope: "A shoot shall sprout from the stump of Jesse." Even where life looks cut down, damaged, or hopeless, God brings new beginnings. This is the message of Advent: that God can bring life from what feels lifeless. John the Baptist reminds us that preparation involves repentance—turning away from what blocks us from God: selfishness, unforgiveness, pride, and spiritual complacency. Advent is a time to slow down, look within, and allow God to straighten what has become crooked in our lives. Saint Paul, in the second reading, urges us to persevere and live in harmony with one another. In a world often divided by anger, fear, or indifference, we are called to be instruments of peace, people who welcome others just as Christ has welcomed us. So as we continue this Advent journey, let us ask ourselves three simple questions:

What needs to be healed or restored in my life? Who do I need to forgive or reconcile with?

How can I make more space for Christ—through prayer, charity, and love?

Let us allow this Advent to be a fresh beginning. May our hearts become the manger where Christ finds a warm welcome, not just at Christmas, but every day.

Come, Lord Jesus, and renew us. Amen.
