# Parish Newsletter THIRTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (C)

TODAY'S MASS READING: Parish Mass Book, from page 155

1st Reading (Sir35: 15b-17,20-22b ).2nd Reading (2Tim 4:6-8, 16-18). Gospel (Lk.18: 9-14)

Readings Next Sunday: 1st Reading (Wis 11:22-12:2). 2nd Reading (2Thes. 1:11-22). Gospel (Lk. 19:1-10)

In the liturgy of the 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year C), the Word of God places before us a profound invitation to humility and trust in God's mercy. The readings

remind us that God is close to those who recognise their need for Him, and that true righteousness does not come from self-promotion or spiritual pride, but from a sincere and humble heart. The first reading from Sirach highlights that the Lord is a God of justice who shows no partiality. He listens attentively to the cries of the poor, the oppressed, and those whose hearts are bowed low. Their prayers, we are told, "pierce the clouds," reminding us that God is especially moved by the humble and those who depend entirely on His love and compassion. The psalm similarly proclaims that "the Lord hears the cry of the poor" and draws near to the broken-hearted. This challenges us to consider whether we, too, stand in solidarity with those whose voices are often ignored in society. God's attention is not captured by power or prestige, but by sincerity and vulnerability. Saint Paul, in the second reading, gives us a living example of this spirituality of trust. Looking back on his life, he speaks of fighting the good fight and keeping the faith, even in times of abandonment. Though others failed to stand by him, Paul declares with confidence that "the Lord stood by me," strengthening him in trials. His witness shows us that Christian discipleship often means persevering guietly, without recognition, trusting that God sees the sacrifices that no one else applauds. Jesus brings all of these lessons together in the Gospel through the parable of the Pharisee and the tax collector at prayer. The Pharisee stands confidently, recounting his good deeds, but his heart is closed off by self-righteousness. The tax collector, however, remains at a distance, unable even to raise his eyes to heaven, and whispers the simple plea: "God, be merciful to me, a sinner." Jesus declares that it is the tax collector, not the Pharisee, who goes home justified. This reveals that justification is not earned by boasting about our virtues but by acknowledging our sinfulness and dependence on God's grace. In our own lives, this Gospel calls us to recognise that holiness is not a competition, nor is prayer a stage for self-display. Each of us is invited to approach God with honesty, admitting that we are always in need of His mercy. Humility frees us from comparison, judgement, and pride. It opens the heart to grace. God desires not perfect performances, but contrite spirits. As we reflect on these readings, we are encouraged to imitate the faith of the humble: to serve quietly and generously, to remain steadfast when our good deeds go unnoticed, and to root our identity not in what we can boast of, but in God's everlasting love. May our prayer, like that of the tax collector, rise from a sincere heart. And may we, too, go home justified—transformed by God's mercy and strengthened to walk humbly with Him in all things. Amen
