### FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT (A)

**TODAY'S MASS READING:** Parish Mass Book, from page 91

**1st Reading (Is.7:10-14) 2nd Reading (Rom.1:1-7) Gospel (Mt.1:18-24)**

As we come to the Fourth Sunday of Advent, we are standing right at the door of Christmas. The waiting is almost over. Today's Gospel, however, does not rush us to the manger. Instead, it invites us to pause and reflect on a quiet but powerful figure in the Christmas story: **Saint Joseph**. Joseph's world collapses when he discovers that Mary is pregnant. For a righteous man in his time, this was a moment of deep confusion, shame, and heartbreak. Joseph could have reacted with anger, fear, or self-protection. He had the legal right to expose Mary publicly. Instead, the Gospel tells us that he planned to dismiss her quietly. This already shows us something important: Joseph was a man of compassion, restraint, and love, even before he fully understood God's plan. Then comes the turning point: *"Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife."* These words—*do not be afraid*—appear again and again in Scripture. God knows how fear can paralyse us, especially when life takes an unexpected turn. Joseph's Advent journey is not about having all the answers; it is about trusting God enough to move forward in faith. Joseph listens. He does not argue with the angel. He does not demand proof. He wakes up and does exactly as the Lord commands. This is quiet obedience, not loud or dramatic, but steady and faithful. Joseph teaches us that holiness often happens in silence, in ordinary decisions made with extraordinary trust. The angel also reveals the child's name: Jesus, meaning "God saves," and Emmanuel, meaning "God is with us." This is the heart of Christmas. God does not remain distant from human confusion, pain, or uncertainty. He enters it. Through Mary's yes and Joseph's obedience, God comes to dwell among us—not as a powerful ruler, but as a vulnerable child. As Christmas draws near, this Gospel invites us to ask ourselves: Where is God asking me to trust, even when I do not fully understand? What fears do I need to place in God's hands? And how can I, like Joseph, make room for Christ through quiet faithfulness? In a world that values noise, speed, and recognition, Saint Joseph reminds us that God often works through those who listen, trust, and act with love. As we prepare to welcome Christ at Christmas, may we open our hearts as Joseph did—so that Emmanuel, God-with-us, may truly dwell in our lives. Amen.


**Pope's December prayer intention:** For Christians in areas of conflict

**Bishop Richard Moth appointed Archbishop of Westminster:** Pope Leo XIV today, 19 December, appointed the Right Reverend Richard Moth as Archbishop of Westminster. Ordained to the priesthood for the Archdiocese of Southwark on 3 July 1982, Archbishop-elect Moth has served as Bishop of Arundel and Brighton since 2015. Prior to that, he was the Catholic Bishop of the Forces from 2009 to 2015. Archbishop-elect Moth will become the 12th Archbishop of Westminster, succeeding Cardinal Vincent Nichols, who has served in the role since 2009. Cardinal Nichols will now become Apostolic Administrator of the Diocese of Westminster until Archbishop-elect Moth is installed at Westminster Cathedral on Saturday, 14 February 2026.


