THE DEDICATION OF THE LATERAN BASILICA (C)

TODAY'S MASS READING: Parish Mass Book, from page 1st Reading(Ez.47:1-2,8-9,12) 2nd Reading (1Cor.3:9c-11,16-17). Gospel (Jn.2:13-22)

Readings Next Sunday: 1st Reading (Mal.4:1-2a). 2nd Reading (2Thes. 3:7-12). Gospel (Lk.21:5-19)

Today, the Church celebrates the Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica. Though many might assume St Peter's Basilica is the

Pope's cathedral, it is actually the Basilica of St John Lateran. It is the oldest basilica in the Western world, built in the 4th century by Emperor Constantine after his conversion. The land on which it stands originally belonged to the Laterani family, hence the name "Lateran." The basilica was dedicated first to Christ the Saviour, and later to St John the Baptist and St John the Evangelist. It is known as the "mother and head of all churches", symbolising the unity of the universal Church under the Bishop of Rome. But this feast is more than a historical memory; it is a spiritual reminder. In the First Reading (Ezekiel 47:1–12), water flows from the temple, bringing life, healing, and fruitfulness. This flowing water symbolises God's grace entering the world through the Church. Where the water flows, life grows. Where God is present, transformation happens. St Paul deepens this point in the Second Reading (1 Corinthians 3:9-17): "You are God's building... you are God's temple." While the Lateran Basilica stands as a visible sign of the Church's unity, its true beauty is reflected in the living stones — you and me. The holiness of a church building only has meaning when the people within it reflect the presence of Christ. In the Gospel (John 2:13-22), Jesus cleanses the temple, showing that God desires a pure place for His presence. He is not merely protecting a building; He is protecting the dignity of worship and calling us to cleanse our own hearts from whatever keeps us far from Him. So, as we celebrate this feast, we are invited to three reflections:

Unity – We are part of a Church that spans centuries and cultures.

Identity – We are temples of the Holy Spirit; God dwells in us.

Conversion – Just as Jesus cleansed the temple. He desires to purify our hearts.

The Lateran Basilica stands as a symbol of permanence, stability, and unity. Yet the true Church is built wherever Christ is welcomed, worshipped, and reflected.

"Lord, cleanse the temple of my heart. Make me a living sign of Your presence in the world."




